TERM	# the term	DEFINITIONS
1. Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)		largest MHSA component (45%); half of funding has to go to Full Service Partnership programming
2. Behavioral Health Department (BHD)		"whatever it takes" commitment to assist in individualized recovery; based upon evidence from such programs as ACT, which has effectively reduced homelessness and hospitalizations while bettering outcomes.
3. Case Management (CM)		funded by Proposition 63 that was passed by the voters in 2004 and assesses a 1% surcharge on all taxable income over \$1 Million; meant to supplement mental health funding and programming available at the time so focus could be placed on new programs; implementation was one component at a time.
4. Community Services and Supports (CSS)		team-based approach to delivering comprehensive and flexible treatment, support and services; provides extensive service for individuals who experience serious mental illness; clients typically have needs that have not been effectively addressed by traditional, less intensive mental health services.
5. Co-occurring Disorder		Medi-Cal for children.
6. Coordinated Care Initiative (CCI)		integrates delivery of medical, behavioral, and long-term care services and also provides a road map to integrate Medicare and Medi-Cal for people in both programs, called "dual eligible" beneficiaries.
7. Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT)		a department of San Diego County's Health and Human Services Agency comprised of the former Mental Health and Alcohol and Drug Services Departments.
8. Full Service Partnership (FSP)		an experiential 12-module education program presented to family members of people with serious mental illness by their peers, trained family members who have similar experiences.
9. Mental Health Services Act (MHSA)		often called Dual Diagnosis but allows for more specificity such as a mental illness with co-occurring substance use disorder or mental illness with co-occurring intellectual disability. Since many individuals have complex conditions and needs, the co-occurring list may include several diagnoses.
10. NAMI Family-to-Family Education Program		pairs licensed, experienced, professional mental health clinicians with specially trained enforcement officers/deputies.
11. Psychiatric Emergency Response Team (PERT)		services help and support people with long-term mental health problems to maintain housing, obtain financial assistance, medical and psychiatric treatment, and link with other community services.
